

### Waiting – Being Actively Still... Is that even possible?

ECFA is so blessed to work with Christ-centered, God-pursuing families; we are often left

humbled and speechless as we observe God at work in our pre-adoptive families' lives. This journey of adoption is not for the faint at heart. It takes patience and endurance. This kind of patience is not of this world but can only be found in God. Our culture does not cultivate patience; it demands things in an instant (fast food, drive-thru's, amazon prime, etc.).

The second phase of the adoption process is referred to as "waiting". For some, this may be a month, and others, it may be up to six years. Yes, that's right - six years! Domestic families "wait" for a call from the agency to receive their permission to show their profile. They "wait" to be chosen by a birthparent(s). They "wait" to see the baby for the first time. And then they "wait" to see the baby for the first time. And then they "wait" for the termination of parental rights hearing assuring them that the birthparent(s) are confident about their placing decision. International families "wait" for their paperwork and dossier to be approved. They "wait" to be matched with a child. They "wait" for country approval. They "wait" to travel. Then they "wait" to meet their child.

We journey with, but cannot adequately express, how

families walk through this phase of adoption. We would like to share some reflections of our current adoptive families in the trenches of "waiting" on God to grow their family.

"Waiting for a child at times can be tear-filled as our



hearts long for something that comes so easily to most. Waiting not just affects us but at times hurts the heart of our daughter as she

asks and hopes for a sibling. But waiting also pushes us closer to our God who has all things planned, a purpose and in turn is constantly bringing peace and comfort in this journey. We could not do it without Him!" -Words of a waiting domestic adoptive mom.

"In the wait, we changed a lot, we went from ASSUMING He would give us what we wanted, to BEGGING Him to give us what we wanted, to getting MAD at God for not giving us what we wanted, and then eventually realizing that what God wants for us is actually better than what we desire. Surrendering your desires to God is NOT easy". -Words of a waiting international adoptive mom

"I am learning to let go of my life even more...and let God hold me and my future in His righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10 – "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.

I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." – Words of a waiting international adoptive mom

In these reflections, it is evident that "waiting", indeed, is being actively still with a fragile heart, open hands, and an attuned heart towards God, trusting Him to know what is the very best!

# Financial Stability – Wisconsin Right to Life for the WIN!!

In ECFA's spring newsletter, our Pregnancy Support Services program shared about the housing partnerships that we have developed in the Greater Milwaukee area for our homeless clients. Another partnership we have cultivated through the years is with Wisconsin Right to Life and their Emergency Grant Program. This grant assists pregnant women who are at risk of homelessness, facing eviction, or simply have fallen on hard financial times. Any agency working with a pregnant woman can apply and receive this money to help provide financially for a pregnant woman's needs. ECFA has partnered with Wisconsin Right to Life on numerous occasions, requesting funds for several of our clients.



"Sarah" (not her real name) was homeless and pregnant when she entered our services. Together, with Sarah, we were able to find a pregnancy home (New Beginnings) for her to live in, but there was a \$250.00 deposit

required. Wisconsin Right to Life emergency grant provided the needed funds for Sarah to move into New Beginnings.

"Shantel" was 8-months pregnant and newly sober. Part of her probation included a stipulation that she needed to live in sober living and participate in sober living programming. Most sober living housing is not free. Shantel was not employable due to being late in pregnancy and her required sobriety programming was a priority for her. Shantel was accepted into Cedar House Sober Living but needed to find a way to pay for the monthly rent of \$700.00. Wisconsin Right to Life's emergency grant approved her request of payment for two months. Shantel has maintained her sobriety, is successfully parenting her son, and has been recently employed.

Sheryl" was pregnant with her second child; both she and her toddler were sleeping on the floor because they couldn't afford a bed to sleep on. Wisconsin Right to Life paid their rent for a month so Sheryl could use her funds to purchase a bed.

"Shaylyn" was working full-time at PetCo but had no benefits and no maternity leave. She needed to pay her rent. She had one eviction on her record

and if she received another, she was at great risk of being homeless with her newborn son, who was born three weeks early. ECFA requested the emergency grant, and



Shaylyn's rent was paid. She was able to spend time bonding with her son in her apartment, free of financial stress, thanks to Wisconsin Right to Life. Shaylyn stated at the close of services, "I truly could not have done it without all of you, you saved my life in a big way! And I say thank you, keep up the great work. One day I hope I can help a girl like me!!!"

At ECFA, our goal is to share our love for Jesus with our clients. But, it is nearly impossible to serve clients' deeper needs (mental health, spiritual, emotional, parental, behavioral, etc.) when they are in constant financial crisis. Thank you, Wisconsin Right to Life, for helping many of our clients maintain financial stability. What a blessing this partnership has been!





# 35th Anniversary Celebration Banquet

An inspiring evening was experienced by everyone who attended the Anniversary Banquet at the Marriott Milwaukee West Hotel on May 17th. A \$15,000 matching grant given to the agency by a like-minded, pro-life, Christian organization was met in full and surpassed with nearly

### **REBUILDING ECFA - Illinois**

It has been over a year since a devastating fire utterly destroyed our main office building at 1530 North Main Street in Wheaton. Fire inspectors determined it was caused by an electrical failure in the wiring above the ceiling in the children's playroom. Since then, our staff has been working from two temporary locations, one in downtown Wheaton, and the other in Lisle, Illinois.



We are happy to report that progress is being made in restoring our building. All our architectural plans have now been approved by the City of Wheaton. The roof has been reconstructed, rough plumbing has been done, the HVAC system is being installed, doorways are being built, windows are being replaced, and the interior framing is underway. We are anticipating that the building will be ready for occupancy by summer's end.


